Location of the conference

The conference will take place at Kronborg Castle, Elsinore, which is situated approximately 50 km north of Copenhagen.

Transportation

Transport from Copenhagen Airport

Going from Copenhagen Airport to Elsinore is very easy. It is possible to take a train directly from Copenhagen Airport to Elsinore. The train goes appoximately every 15 minutes. It takes about 45 minutes. From Elsinore station by taxi, it takes about 5 minutes to the Hotel Marienlyst.

Tuesday the 29th we will arrange transport from Kronborg Castle to Copenhagen Airport at 15.00.

Transport from Hotel Marienlyst to Kronborg Castle and back

Monday and Tuesday morning a coach will bring you from the hotel Marienlyst to Kronborg Castle.

Of course you are very welcome to take the walk yourselves. It is a 15 minutes walk from the hotel to the Castle.

Monday night there will also be a coach bringing you from Kronborg Castle to the hotel and back to the dinner party at Kronborg Castle. And a coach will bring you back to the hotel afterwards.

The weather

In the end of September the day time temperatures in Denmark are about 15 degrees Celsius and both sun and rain can be expected.

Welcome to Kronborg Castle

Kronborg Castle in Elsinore, at the seaward approach to The Sound Øresund, is one of northern Europe's most important Renaissance castles.

Known all over the world from Shakespeare's play Hamlet, it is also the most famous castle in Denmark and is visited each year by about 200,000 tourists.





King Frederik II's Kronborg is both an elegant Renaissance castle and a monumental military fortress surrounded by major fortifications with bastions and ravelins. Some of the historical rooms house collections of Renaissance and Baroque interiors, and among the most important attractions are the 62-metre long ballroom, the wonderfully preserved chapel and the statue of "Holger the Dane".

Development of Kronborg Castle

During the period 1998-2010, Kronborg Castle is undergoing extensive development to turn it into a modern exhibition centre and visitor attraction. The restoration of the buildings and fortress areas go hand-in-hand with the development of the historical presentation of the castle to the public.
